A SWATH OF RAIN WILL PUSH THROUGH THE STATE TODAY AHEAD OF A WARM FRONT. THE FRONT IS ASSOCIATED WITH A LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM WHICH IS NOW CENTERED OVER EASTERN MISSOURI. THE STEADIEST RAIN WILL OCCUR FROM THIS AFTERNOON INTO THIS EVENING WITH RAINFALL AMOUNTS BETWEEN ONE QUARTER AND ONE HALF INCH LIKELY. HIGH TEMPERATURES TODAY WILL BE IN THE 50S STATEWIDE EXCEPT NEAR PHILADELPHIA WHERE TEMPERATURES WILL NEAR 60.

LINGERING SHOWERS ARE POSSIBLE OVERNIGHT BUT SHOULD COMPLETELY COME TO AN END BY SATURDAY MORNING. LOW TEMPERTURES TONIGHT WILL RANGE FROM THE LOW 30S OVER THE NORTHERN MOUNTAINS TO THE MID FORTIES OVER THE SOUTHERN TIER.

THIS LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM WILL PASS TO THE SOUTHEAST OF THE COMMONWEALTH USHERING IN NORTHERLY WINDS. THESE WINDS COULD BE GUSTY WITH SUSTAINED SPEEDS BETWEEN 10 AND 20 MPH. THE WINDS WILL ALSO BRING CLEARING SKIES WITH PARTLY CLOUDY SKIES EXPECTED BY SATURDAY AFTERNOON. HIGH TEMPERATURES WILL BE IN THE MID TO UPPER 40S OVER THE NORTHERN MOUNTAINS AND THE LAURELS AND THE MID TO UPPER 50S ELSEWHERE. COMPLETE CLEARING IS EXPECTED BY SATURDAY NIGHT. LOWS WILL RANGE FROM AROUND TWENTY IN THE NORTHERN MOUNTAINS TO JUST ABOVE FREEZING OVER THE SOUTHEAST.
