SPRING IS ON HOLD THROUGH WEDNESDAY FOLLOWING THE PASSAGE OF YESTERDAYS STRONG COLD FRONT. COLD NORTHWEST WINDS WILL BRING WITH THEM SOME LAKE EFFECT SNOW. BY WEDNESDAY MORNING UP TO SIX INCHES OF SNOW ACCUMULATION IS POSSIBLE OVER NORTHWEST PENNSYLVANIA AND THE LAURELS. HIGHEST AMOUNTS ARE EXPECTED IN AREAS JUST SOUTHEAST OF THE LAKE SHORE. LIGHT ACCUMULATIONS ARE POSSIBLE OVER SOUTHWESTERN AND NORTH CENTRAL PORTIONS OF THE STATE. UNDER CLOUDY SKIES, HIGH TEMPERATURES TODAY WILL RANGE FROM THE LOW 30S OVER WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA TO THE UPPER 40S OVER THE EAST. LOWS TONIGHT WILL BE IN THE MID TO UPPER 20S STATEWIDE WITH PHILADELPHIA BEING THE EXCEPTION AND HOLDING IN THE LOWER 30S.

SKIES WILL PARTIALLY CLEAR WEDNESDAY AS A WEAK HIGH PRESSURE SYSTEM APPROACHES THE COMMONWEALTH...THERE IS STILL THE CHANCE OF SNOW SHOWERS EARLY IN THE DAY OVER THE NORTHWEST. HIGH TEMPERATURES WILL RANGE FROM THE 40S OVER THE WEST AND POCONOS TO THE LOW 50S OVER THE SOUTHEAST.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT WILL BE PARTLY TO MOSTLY CLOUDY WITH LOW TEMPERATURES IN THE UPPER 20S ACROSS THE NORTHERN TIER AND LOW TO MID 30S OVER THE SOUTHERN TIER. TEMPERATURES WILL RECOVER TO AVERAGE BY THURSDAY WITH HIGHS STATEWIDE IN THE 50S.

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
